3.5	1478.30	Born ten weeks premature, and brain damaged at birth. He has a diagnosis of cerebral palsy, and has significant difficulties with mobility. Proposal was for a special exercise trike to try to help his strength, mobility and coordination. We agreed to fund the full cost.
	387.60	Severe learning difficulties and ASD, exhibiting challenging behaviour. We helped in late 2018 with a strong chair and soft wall cladding. She is responding well and one small additional item was requested, which we approved.
3	1358.45	Born prematurely and presents with development delay and walking difficulties, now diagnosed as cerebral palsy mainly affecting his legs. His Paediatric Physiotherapist recommended a special exercise trike to help to exercise his leg muscles and build strength, and after a detailed assessment by the supplier, we agreed to fully fund.
	1981.00	Request from Victoria Special School to help with funding an outdoor exercise gym for the senior school (14-19). 90% of the 220 pupils (130 in senior school) are wheelchair bound, and they requested an outdoor gym facility, which will help with exercise as well as encouraging them to work together. With a total project cost of £10,000, we agreed to fund one one of the three items of gym equipment required and some of the installation costs.
4	1107.15	She has a diagnosis of quadriplegic cerebral palsy and presents with severe movement difficulties. She is fully dependent for all changes of position, and already has a subluxed hip (<i>partial dislocation</i>) requiring surgery. Proposal was for a P Pod bean seat to hold and support her in the correct postural position, in a comfortable chair into which she could be securely strapped, to protect her from further dislocations. We agreed to fully fund.
20	1000.00	Cerebral palsy, profound and multiple learning difficulties, and extensive medical needs. He is fully wheelchair bound, and we have helped previously in 2015 with funding an Acheeva bed. A powered wheelchair is now required, and a Sunrise medical Q700 Stand Up chair at £20,383.15 was proposed. With £11,000 already raised. We agreed to fund a further £1,000.00.
3.5	£97.00 + £131.50	She was born 3 months prematurely, and has a diagnosis of cerebral palsy, hydrocephalus, and chronic lung disease. The family has recently been given a special needs buggy, but no accessories (as usual). Request is for a cover and a special seat liner. We previously helped her in 2017, and this will further assist the family.
10.7	294.00	She has a diagnosis of cerebral palsy spastic quadriplegia, and is a full time wheel chair user. She requires suitable support and needs a correctly designed special needs buggy for her requirements. We agreed to fund a Maclaren Major Elite buggy for her.
	1707.00	Request from Pens Meadow Special School for a Prone Stander for use by two children with Leukodystrophy (<i>a disease of the white matter of the brain</i>). This is a regularly used item and we agreed to fully fund.
12	510.00	Microcephaly, severe epilepsy, global development delay and severe learning difficulties. Her existing buggy was broken and she urgently required a larger stronger unit. After further discussion and assessment by a regular supplier, a suitable buggy was specified, which, due to family circumstances, we agreed to fully fund.
5	3825.00	Severe autism and sight problems. Due to his condition he requires full time care, and at school he is taught on a 1:1 basis, segregated from the other children due to his problems. With the family desperate for some respite, the proposal was to provide a safety sleeper to settle him down at night, which was trialled successfully. We agreed to fully fund at a reduced cost following our agreed discount structure with the supplier.
3.75	1411.75	Born prematurely, she has a diagnosis of cerebral palsy spastic diplegia, with limited lower leg movement, having only just managed to be able to sit unaided on the floor. Her Paediatric Physiotherapist recommended a special exercise trike to try to build up her leg muscle strength, and her core strength, to help her to start walking. With the family able to make a small contribution, we funded the balance required.
	955.00	Small Wonders Stay & Play provides a pre-school community facility in the Wolverhampton area for currently 210 children with a waiting list. A number have special needs, and we were asked to help to provide additional sensory room equipment, which we agreed to fund after a discount was agreed with the supplier.
	378.50	Grant to Worcesterchire Health & Care NHS Trust to help with the purchase of small items of hygiene equipment to help a number of children.
6	1656.16	She has a diagnosis of cerebral palsy with complex medical issues relating to feeding. We helped her in 2016 with a Special Tomato comfy seat which she has outgrown, and which has been passed on to another family. Urgent help was needed for a secure and comfy Ppod Bean seat. With no other funding available, we agreed to fully fund.
6	2065.00	She has a diagnosis of Infantile Batten Disease (<i>this is a rare fatal inherited disorder, which results in seizures, regression of gross motor and cognition skills, and vision loss</i>). The prognosis is poor as there is no cure. She had outgrown her car seat, which had been passed on to her younger brother, and required a new seat urgently. With her serious condition, a very special seat was required, which even with the discount from our regular supplier was significantly more expensive than usual. With no other funding available, we agreed to fully fund.
3	1283.00	Born prematurely, he suffered a brain bleed, and has a diagnosis of diplegic cerebral palsy, hydrocephalus, epilepsy, nystagmus, chronic lung disease and sensory processing difficulties. His Paediatric Physiotherapist recommended a special exercise trike to help to build his core and leg muscle strength to try to help his mobility, and we agreed to fully fund.

12	537.49	She has an eye condition called bilateral optic nerve hypoplasia (<i>under developed optic nerves</i>) has no light perception in one eye and reduced vision in the other. We helped her two years ago with computer equipment which is in daily use and has helped her to progress academically. We received a request for further equipment to help her with her studies, and we agreed to fully fund.
12	2133.51	He has a diagnosis of Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy, and has recently deteriorated, now using a wheelchair full time at school. He required a hydrotilt chair to support him in the correct postural position, and to provide some comfortable seating, as he currently has no suitable seating when at home. We agreed to fully fund.
2.25	493.00	He has a diagnosis of Chromosome 22q11 duplication, which presents as microcephaly, global development delay, vision problems, and hypotonia. He is unable to sit unsupported, and is being provided with a special buggy by Wheelchair Services. A fully supportive special car seat was required to hold him in the correct position, which we agreed to fully fund.
6	632.00	He has a diagnosis of Down's Syndrome, chronic lung disease, a residual VSD following heart surgery, learning disabilities, and he can only walk for short distances. We were asked to fund a fully supportive special car seat to hold him safely and securely for transport, as he escapes from his current seat. He was fully assessed at RDAC, and we agreed to fully fund the seat required.
3.7	533.00	She has a severe learning disability, sensory problems and is being assessed for autism. The proposal was for a special seat to help with her sensory skills, and enable her to engage more in activities. We agreed to fully fund.
7	1000.00	Cerebral palsy, epilepsy, minimal head control, abnormal arm movements, and problems with taking food. Currently peg fed, and with other problems, an Acheeva bed was required to help with his daily needs. With a cost of £5,270.00 we needed to co-fund and pledged £1,000.00 pending the balance of funding being raised.
3.5	279.67	He has a diagnosis of microcephaly and epilepsy, significant global development delay, and hearing and visual impairment. Dudley Vision Impairment Service recommended a number of small items to help him to develop with his limited sight, and we agreed to fully fund.
4.5	1,185.65	He has a diagnosis of cerebral palsy spastic diplegia and a Chiari malformation (<i>brain abnormality</i>). He has walking difficulties, uses leg splints, a walker and a standing frame, and will shortly start using a wheelchair which he will need when he begins school. His Paediatric Physiotherapist recommended a special exercise trike to help to build his leg and trunk muscle strength, and to improve his coordination. With the family having raised £200.00, we agreed to fund the balance required for the purchase to proceed.
1.3	516.00	She has a diagnosis of Cerebral palsy spastic quadriplegia, is unable to sit unaided, has mobility problems, is tube fed, and she has vision problems. The proposal was to fund a special activity mat which has a facility to securely hold and fully support her, which would help her development. We agreed to fully fund.
10.5	709.75	He has a diagnosis of Idiopathic Juvenile Osteoporosis which has presented as vertebral compression fractures. He has low strength in his lower limbs and a special exercise trike was proposed to help to build his leg strength. The cost with our discount structure was £1,424.75, and with another charity contributing £715.00, a balance of £709.75 was required which we agreed to fund.
1	459.25	He was born with a chromosome deletion which exhibits as development delay, epilepsy, and arthropyrosis (<i>joint contractures</i>) and needs a number of items of special needs equipment. We were asked to help with the purchase of a special car seat and agreed to fully fund.
10	319.00	He has a range of vision problems which can not be corrected by glasses. He currently has to use large print text books which limits his access to information. The request was for a suitable iPad to allow him to read much larger font, and it will also help him to access a wider range of information, particularly important as he is about to move on to Secondary School, so we agreed to approve the funding.
17 16	1183.00 + 179.00	Request for the purchase of two items of mobility equipment for senior pupils at Penn Hall Special School. One has a complex medical history with a range of problems, including treatment for a brain tumour, and he requires a special seating system to fully support him in class. The other is for a student with a diagnosis of Ullrich congenital muscular dystrophy, who requires an abductor to assist with her personal care. In view of the extreme pressure on special school equipment budgets, we agreed to fully fund.
5	1285.85	She has a genetic condition with duplication of chromosome 1q, resulting in hypotonia (<i>low muscle tone</i>) and learning difficulties. She can walk but has poor balance and fatigues easily, and her Paediatric Physiotherapist recommended a special exercise trike to help to develop her muscle strength and coordination. With the family having raised £200.00 towards the cost, we agreed to fund the balance.
	1358.45	He has a diagnosis of cerebral palsy spastic diplegia, and is starting to make some progress, now being able to take a few steps with a K-Walker. He needs to develop his leg muscle strength, and a special exercise trike was proposed by his Physiotherapist. We agreed to fund the purchase following a full assessment by the supplier.
11	249.98	She has a diagnosis of cerebral palsy, microcephaly and development delay. To help her development Rebound therapy was proposed, and we were asked to help. We are familiar with this technique, used extensively at two local special schools, and we agreed to fund.
4.5	339.53	He has multiple medical, learning and behavioural needs and is in a long term foster care placement. A suitable car seat was required to provide the support required, with a tilt/turn function to allow easy access. The price was reduced by our agreed discount with the supplier and we agreed to fully fund.
7	1917.00	He has a severe learning disability and a diagnosis of ASD (<i>Autistic Spectrum Disorder</i>), and requires extensive supervision from his mother who acts as a full time carer. A special exercise trike was proposed by his Paediatric Occupational Therapist to help his development, and we agreed to fully fund.
14	1795.03	She has a diagnosis of unbalanced translocation of chromosome 22, which exhibits as gross development delay and mobility

		problems. She has outgrown her walker, and was recently re-assessed for a new unit for use at school. As this is now too large to transport, we have been requested to help with funding a similar unit for home use, which is a request we often receive. We agreed to fully fund.
12	1909.15	Diagnosis of a grade 2 intrinsic spinal cord tumour in 2016, resection surgery followed by Proton Beam Therapy, which was successful. He is still working to rebuild his leg muscle strength, and balance and his Paediatric Physiotherapist recommended a special exercise trike, which we agreed to fully fund.
4 + 3	1300.00	Special exercise trikes for two brothers. The older child has a diagnosis of cerebral palsy and has limited mobility due to weakness in the trunk and legs. A trike was proposed to help to develop his muscles and improve coordination. The younger child acquired a spinal cord injury at birth and has no leg movement. The proposal was for a hand pedalled trike to help to strengthen his upper body and improve his coordination. Approx 50% of the cost of each trike had already been pledged, and we were asked to fund the balance to allow purchase to proceed.
3.7	167.00	She has a diagnosis of Down's Syndrome and extreme hypermobility. A special needs buggy supplied by Wheelchair Services but the accessories are not supplied (as usually occurs). Request for help funding the canopy and rain cover which we agreed to fund.
11	1588.80	He has a diagnosis of cerebral visual impairment, severe learning difficulties, and ataxia, which presents as a number of conditions including poor muscle coordination and speech problems. Request was for a special exercise trike to help to develop his muscle strength and coordination, and we agreed to fully fund.
9	530.72	He has a diagnosis of Autism, and has a severe learning disability. He releases himself from his safety harness when being transported and can exhibit challenging behaviour. He was assessed at the RDAC for a magnetic harness which held him safe and secure, and we were asked if we could provide the funding, which we approved.
5	500.00	He has a diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorder, is mobile, but requires constant supervision, and is dependent on his parents for all aspects of daily living. He needed a new special car seat with a secure harness to fully restrain him, and with the family able to raise £132.00 towards the £632.00 cost, we agreed to fund the balance required.
12	2000.00	He has a diagnosis of Dandy Walker Syndrome, and global development delay. With no sense of danger, he had learned how to escape from his current bed, putting himself at risk, and a cot bed was required to hold him safely. Newlife had loaned the family a bed for a period, while funds were raised, but with the bed needed for another child, we were asked if we could help with the funding. The total cost was £6,925.00, and with the family still £2,000.00 short of the required amount, we agreed to fund the balance needed.
3	1705.00	He has a diagnosis of a left hemiplegia, affecting one side of his body. Although he can sit upright, he rapidly tires, and needs full support. He requires regular transport to both his special nursery, and his physiotherapy sessions. Having outgrown his current car seat, we were asked if we could help with funding for a special car seat with a tilt/turn facility, and a harness to hold him securely. We agreed to fully fund, with the price being reduced by our agreed discount.
9.5	440.79	He has congenital cataracts in both eyes, and we were asked by the Dudley Vision Impairment Service if we could help with funding computer equipment to help him. Dudley MBC can reclaim any VAT, and we agreed to fund the remaining cost.
10	2521.13	She has a diagnosis of diplegic cerebral palsy, which exhibits as weakness in her legs and trunk. After assessment, a semi recumbent special exercise trike was proposed to help to build up her lower body strength. With the family able to provide some funding, we agreed to fund the balance required.
	1457.00	We were asked to fund a special chair to provide the correct postural support, with variable height adjustment for different activities, for a special school. The chair was to be used by a little girl with a series of complex physical difficulties, and while she had a similar unit at home, she was having to use a small wooden chair at school, which was not suitable for her. With the school equipment budget under great pressure, we agreed to help and fully fund the chair.
4	1448.55	He has a number of medical problems and suffers with recurrent chest infections. He uses a frame to try to get him walking, and a special exercise trike was proposed to help to build his leg muscles and general fitness. He was fully assessed by the supplier and was capable of using the trike. We agreed to fully fund the purchase, the cost being reduced by our discount agreement with the supplier.
9	1875.75	He has a diagnosis of Wolf Hirschhorn Syndrome, has limited independent mobility and requires full adult support. He uses special boots and a standing frame, but we were asked to help with funding a Cavalier Walker to try to get him walking. With the family having raised some funding, we agreed to fund the balance required for the purchase to proceed.
3.5	990.70	He has a diagnosis of Periventricular Leukomalacia (<i>a type of brain injury which can occur with premature birth</i>) is non mobile and unable to sit without full support. His current seating system holds him correctly for eating etc., but is uncomfortable for any extended period. He needed a suitable fully supportive comfortable seating system, and a P-pod bean seat was proposed, which we agreed to fund.
5.5	1570.10	She has very limited mobility, uses a wheelchair for general transportation, and a standing frame both at home and at school to help to prevent deterioration of her legs. A special exercise trike was proposed to try to further build her leg muscles, and we agreed to fully fund.
4	637.49	He has a diagnosis of ASD and presents with challenging behaviour. He needs a safe space within a special needs pushchair when out with his mother to help to control his behaviour. A Special Tomato pushchair was proposed and we agreed to fully fund.

0.6	300.00	Diagnosis of a congenital disorder of Glycosylation, exhibiting as severe and intractable epilepsy, hypotonia, global development delay, and visual impairment. Unable to support himself and needs a fully supportive special car seat. With the family able to contribute to the discounted cost of £442.64, a balance of £300.00 was required which we agreed to fund.
2	348.16	Diagnosis of Wolf Hirschhorn Syndrome, exhibiting as facial disfigurement, global development delay, seizures and hypotonia. He needed a fully supportive car seat to hold him securely, and we agreed to fully fund.
7.5	1451.95	Born at 28 weeks, she exhibits with learning difficulties and gross motor delay. She has dysmorphic features and microcephaly, and is awaiting genetic investigation. Although mobile, she can only walk short distances, and a special exercise trike was proposed to try to develop her leg muscles, general strength, and co-ordination. We agreed to fully fund the final cost, reduced by VAT exemption and our supplier discount.
6	1073.35	He has a diagnosis of Joubert Syndrome (a brain disorder affecting movement and coordination), and Dandy Walker Syndrome as well as other medical problems. He is unable to stand or walk independently and uses a wheelchair. The proposal was to fund a special exercise trike to develop his leg strength and general condition, as well as helping to develop his coordination. After our discount from the supplier and a contribution from the family, we agreed to fund the balance required.
5	443.50	Microdeletion of DMD gene, global development delay, gastrostomy fed, scoliosis, and visual impairment. She needed a special car seat to hold her safely and securely for transport, suitably adapted for her particular condition. With another charity providing a grant of £2,000.00, we agreed to fund the remaining balance required.
5	1605.00	He was born prematurely and has a range of medical problems including breathing and bowel difficulties, and is gastrostomy fed. He needs a special support chair and tray system, and his NHS Trust has not currently approved anything suitable for his needs. His Paediatric Physiotherapist had sourced a suitable seating system, so we were asked to help, and agreed to fully fund.
19	5757.82	He sustained a brain injury at the age of 13 years, and spent 3 months in a coma, 6 months in rehabilitation, and left with some limited mobility and poor balance, he is a full time wheelchair user. Both he and his physiotherapist are keen for him to exercise to maintain his fitness, as he has a long term condition. He was a keen cyclist, but with weak legs and poor balance, he requires an electrically assisted special trike to enable him to exercise regularly. In view of the cost this was co-funded, with another local charity – Friends of Alfie Johnson – who provided £2,500.00, and the Chris Westwood Charity provided the balance needed of £3,257.82, after our discount arrangement with Quest88. A single combined payment was made to simplify the purchase.
7	1795.00	He has muscular dystrophy, exhibits behavioural and learning difficulties and has bowel problems. Although mobile, he fatigues quickly and uses a wheelchair regularly. His current wheelchair weighs 20 kg, which is too heavy for him to self propel, and he has difficulty turning it, meaning that he needs adult assistance when using it. This is a progressive condition and long term he will require a powered wheelchair, but that will present problems loading/unloading into transport, requiring significant changes. The proposal was to fund a lightweight wheelchair (8 kg) which will be easy for him to handle, and also his carers, as well as easy to load/unload into transport. With the Boparan Charity funding £2,000.00, we agreed to fund the balance needed.
8.5	529.68	Severe autism, unpredictable behaviour and exhibits Pica Syndrome. We funded a special car seat in March 2015, but he now releases himself periodically, and requires a secure harness to hold him safely and comfortably. The proposal was for a magnetic harness, which we agreed to fully fund.
4.5	1688.13	He has a diagnosis of cerebral palsy, significant global development delay and epilepsy, and is peg fed. He has mobility problems and is unable to sit upright unaided. He has a Triton chair which provides the support required to hold him securely at a table, but it is not very comfortable, and a request was submitted to fund a Ppod Bean seat with straps to hold him securely and in comfort. This can also be wheeled around in the house which is another advantage. With both parents acting as carers as they have two children with disabilities, we were asked if we could provide the required funding, which we agreed to do.
12	900.00	She has a diagnosis of cerebral palsy, microcephaly and development delay. We have previously helped on several occasions including part funding an exercise machine to help her leg muscles. She has now outgrown this and needs a larger unit which will suit her into adulthood. We again agreed to part fund the request to assist the family with their applications to other charities for the balance of funding needed.
12	1500.75	She has a diagnosis of Spinal Muscular Atrophy Type 2, and is a full time wheelchair user. She has again outgrown her wheelchair and a new chair has been provided by Wheelchair Services. This is a basic chair, and with the knowledge gained from her previous chair, as well as some deterioration in her condition, three additional accessory items were proposed to help her comfort and mobility, which we agreed to fund. As this was a Sunrise Medical wheelchair, we were able to arrange an extra discount as Sunrise Medical kindly support our work, being based local to us.
3.25	561.85	Cerebral palsy spastic quadriplegia, and after weekly therapy he is starting to walk, using a Kaye walker. We were asked to fund a second unit for home use, as transport of his existing unit is difficult, and it is important to capitalise on the progress he is starting to make, so we agreed to fully fund.
7	473.35	She has a diagnosis of Asymmetric Quadriplegia (cerebral palsy), and while using a wheelchair for much of the time, she is encouraged to use a walker whenever possible. Her unit at school is too large to transport and she has outgrown her existing unit at home. Without constant use her condition will deteriorate, so we agreed to provide the balance of funding needed by the family to enable a new walker to be purchased.
3	617.00	She has a diagnosis of Autistic Spectrum Disorder, has no sense of danger, and was releasing herself from her car seat when being transported, with consequent hazard. A new seat and harness system was proposed to hold her safely and securely, which we

		agreed to fully fund.
13.5	753.00	He has a diagnosis of Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy and two years ago we funded a supine stander for him. He now requires additional parts to enable adjustment for his growth so that the stander can continue to be used. We agreed to fund the extra items needed.
2	623.00	Diagnosis of cerebral palsy spastic quadriplegia and required a number of items. He had been supplied with a special buggy by Wheelchair Services but they do not supply the rain/sun covers. A special base was also required to adapt his seating to act as a high chair, holding him securely when at a table. We agreed to approve all three items as the family was already heavily committed in adapting their property for his future needs.
4	740.00	Diagnosis of Downs Syndrome and development delay, and she was born with a heart condition. Her motor skills are delayed and she has problems walking any distance so needs to use a buggy. A special exercise trike was propose which we agreed to co-fund with her special school. The price was reduced to £1,470.95 with our discount, and the school agreed to fund the balance.
2.8 + 1.8	904.00	Both have a diagnosis of complex and emerging development needs, and neither is currently walking. This results in the need to be transported everywhere in a buggy, and as the children are growing, a suitable special needs twin buggy was required, which we agreed to fully fund.
3	1425.05	He was born prematurely, and has a diagnosis of Periventricular Leucomalacia, exhibiting as global development delay and limited movement. He has just started to crawl, but can only stand using his standing frame. The proposal was to fund a special exercise trike to help to develop his leg and trunk strength, and improve his coordination, which we agreed to fully fund.
4	617.00	Diagnosis of Downs Syndrome and development delay, and she was born with a heart condition. Her motor skills are delayed and she has problems walking any distance so needs to use a buggy. She is a Looked After Child under the care of her grandparents who have to lift her in/out of her car seat which is also now too small for her. She needed a new larger seat with easier access and we agreed to fully fund.
6	215.88	He has a diagnosis of Autism, sleep problems and behavioural difficulties. He has been using a light table at his special school and this has helped him to focus and improve his concentration and learning. The proposal was to fund a similar unit for home use so that the advantages of using a table can be further extended. We agreed to fully fund, having helped previously and being aware of this case.
13	2333.09	She has a diagnosis of Osteogenesis Imperfecta Type 3 (<i>a brittle bone condition leading to regular fractures</i>), together with other medical and development problems. The proposal was to purchase a special exercise trike to try to develop her leg strength and improve her general health. With the family having raised a small amount, we agreed to fund the balance, the final cost being reduced by £1,105.97 due to the claim for VAT exemption and our discount agreement with the supplier.
17	462.00	Diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorder, severe learning disability and severe challenging behaviour. No awareness of danger and attempts now being made to upgrade his bedroom for his adult needs, with suitable equipment to withstand his seriously challenging behaviour, while keeping him safe. We agreed to help with funding equipment requested.
6	415.00	He has a diagnosis of Downs Syndrome and other medical problems. He was able to release himself from his car seat during transport and a new seating system was required with a more secure magnetic lock harness to hold him safely and securely. With the family in a position to co-fund, and the cost reduced to £828.57 with our discount, we agreed to fund the £415.00 needed.
9.75	1064.95	She has a diagnosis of microcephaly, which exhibits as development delay. A special exercise trike was proposed to help to develop her co-ordination and motor skills, and improve her general fitness. With the family having raised some funding, we agreed to provide the balance required for the purchase to proceed.
9	332.50	He has a visual impairment which can not be corrected by his glasses as a result of a number of conditions. He is now having problems accessing reading text, and Dudley Vision Impairment Service have recommended an iPad for use at both school and at home. With no school budget available, we were asked if we could fund this equipment, which we agreed to do.
17	2449.56	Learning difficulties, epilepsy, diagnosis of autism and suffers frequent painful subluxations (<i>partial dislocations</i>) of her knee caps. Her Paediatric Physiotherapist recommended a special exercise trike to help with her exercises to try to build leg muscle strength to resolve the painful dislocation problem.
